Pacifica Play Day, 4-9-2016

Please join us for event eight of our 2015-2016 season which will be a play day on Saturday, April 9th at Hillside Swedenborgian Community Church, 1422 Navellier Street, El Cerrito, CA 94530. The Church's website is http://hillsideswedenborg.org. We will meet in the Sanctuary. Please try to arrive by 9:00 am for coffee/tea and conversation until about 9:15, to be followed by morning playing events beginning at 9:30 until lunch around 12:30. After lunch, there will be un-coached afternoon playing sessions from about 1:30 pm until about 3:00 pm.



We are extremely pleased to once again have Pat O'Scannell coaching us for this play day. We know that our repertoire as gambists often comes from the vocal genres....but to what degree are we informed by the words? It may be anachronistic to see too much of a connection between the texts and their meaning and the overall feel of a piece, however what about the words themselves? How do we play a piece in Italian, verses one in English, Spanish or French? Does the quality of the consonants infuse our articulations? Do we make any adjustments at all when moving from a French piece to a German piece?

Pat will present a few simple vocal pieces which use language in an idiomatic way, and will choose repertoire that falls strongly

into its mother tongue by ignoring more melismatic songs in favor of syllabic so we can really get a sense of the language.

Here is a short biography for Pat: Pat O'Scannell has been a musician and musical director for over 30 years. She has worked for the Old Globe Theatre in San Diego, the Utah Shakespeare Festival, and for 25 years, the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, where she directed the Terra Nova Consort. Her group toured nationally and internationally, and made appliances at such festivals as Tage Alter Musik (200 & 2003) and the Festival Internacional Cervatino in Mexico where they and a seven-year collaboration with Mexican group: Los Tiempos Pasados. Pat is a pioneer in exploring new repertoire for the viol in a broken consort setting, as her band included lute, vocals, recorders, double reeds, sackbut, violin and percussion in addition to violas da gamba. Pat founded a Collegium Musicum program at Southern Oregon University, and has taught there as adjunct faculty to the Music department. She now teaches out of her private studio in

Ashland, Oregon. Pat produced 17 recordings, two of which were released on the Dorian label. She has been heard on Public radio worldwide, including the syndicated broadcasts: 'Harmonia' (IN), West Coast Live (CA), In the Mode (CA) and St. Paul Sunday (MN).

Our early morning group session with Pat will be followed by a coffee/tea break at about 10:30 am. After the break, consort playing sessions (mostly one-on-a-part) in assigned groups using Pacifica Library music selected by each group will continue until the lunch break at about 12:30 pm. Coaching will be provided by Pat on a time-shared basis depending on how many groups we have. You may go out for lunch or bring a lunch to eat in the beautiful Hillside Church Sanctuary view. If you can, please plan to stay for un-coached consort playing in the afternoon after lunch, beginning about 1:30 pm until about 3:00 pm.

Please respond to our consort coordinator, Dalton Cantey, if you plan to attend the morning and/or afternoon sessions. For the morning sessions, tell him what size gamba(s) you will bring. If you would prefer to double a part in our normal "one-on-a-part" consort playing please indicate that. The un-coached consort sessions in the afternoon will include a group in the Sanctuary where part doubling is encouraged. Sign-up sheets will be provided in the morning for those who would prefer to organize one-on-a-part consorts on their own in the two downstairs playing spaces for the afternoon. Please respond before the end of the day on Thursday (April 7th) to expedite formation of assigned groups for the following Saturday morning. Donations to VdGS-Pacifica Through SFEMS

If you plan to make a donation to VdGS-Pacifica and you itemize deductions for tax purposes, your check should be made payable to SFEMS, the San Francisco Early Music Society. However, please do not mail donations for VdGS-Pacifica directly to SFEMS or try to donate to VdGS-Pacifica online through the SFEMS web page. There has been confusion in the past that led SFEMS staff to interpret donations intended for VdGS-Pacifica as donations to SFEMS. Checks should be given or mailed to our Treasurer, Ellen Fisher, who will note them and send them to SFEMS with instructions to credit them to VdGS-Pacifica. SFEMS will do the tax paperwork and send us checks reflecting cumulative donations over a given time period. If you don't plan to itemize deductions, it is easier for us if your donation check is made payable to VdGS-Pacifica, and it will be deposited directly to our bank account.
