Member Spotlight on Lynn Lipetzky

Tell me how long have you been playing gamba, and how you first got involved.

I was first exposed to the viola da gamba close to 20 years ago. I had been playing recorder in a mixed consort group in San Diego. Our host, Elizabeth Rose, played a tenor viol which she decided to sell in order to upgrade. I purchased her very nice Larry Higgins tenor, bought Alison Crum's book Play the Viol, and taught myself. Soon after, I started going to play days and workshops.

What's the best/worst thing about playing gamba?

The best thing for me about playing the viol is the lovely voice like sounds that a well tuned consort can produce. And, more importantly, the joy of sharing the music with friends in an intimate setting.

Who is your gamba role model or hero, and why?

So many wonderful teachers have influenced my playing and appreciation of the viol, but I'll mention three in particular: David Morris, Julie Jeffrey, and Joanna Blendulf. Not only are they superb musicians, but they have kindly shared their love of music with a generosity of spirit and joy which I would hope to be able to pass on to others as well.

You're also a board member and the Rental Coordinator for the chapter. What's that like?

I am a believer in giving back to the community which has given me so much, so I am glad to make the commitment in this way. It's wonderful to hand a viol to a new player and realize it is opening a new world of music for them! The job does require vigilance though, as we have 15 viols to maintain and keep track of.

What is a favorite memory associated with the Pacifica chapter?

My favorite memories associated with Pacifica are those surrounding the camaraderie and music making at the San Luis Obispo summer workshop and the (now defunct) North-South meet in Fresno.

What trends do you see in the gamba community and how do you think the Pacifica chapter will change over the next five years?

There will always be change, welcome or not. Some of our more senior members who were in the forefront of the Early Music revival are retiring from an active roles in their chapters. Happily, the community will stay healthy thanks to efforts of those like Melita Denny at UC Davis who are bringing along young players to replace us "oldies"! And I see trends among both young and old to use the viol in more contemporary musical settings.

What are some of your hobbies and interests outside of playing gamba?

I must admit that my love of music is second to my love of being out in the natural environment: hiking, camping, kayaking, swimming, gardening!

What might (someone) be surprised to know about you?

I miss my little farm in San Diego, but I do get to have a small coop of bantam chickens here in El Cerrito!
