Mary Springfels has been active in the American early music movement for all of her adult life. Her early career was spent as a member of the New York Pro Musica, and as a freelancer in New York. For 25 years, she directed the Newberry Consort, whose recordings still set a high standard of performance. During her time in Chicago, Mary was a Senior Lecturer at The University of Chicago and Northwestern University, and active in the Chicago baroque music scene. 10 years ago, she moved to New Mexico, and has been teaching and playing in California and the Southwest.



Mary has been a stalwart faculty member of the VdGSA Conclave since 1976, and taught at SFEMS workshops for at least 30 years. This summer, Mary will appear with Christine Brandes and Elizabeth Blumenstock at the 2018 Berkeley Early Music Festival.

Mary's Plan: I'll be offering two motets: the Josquin Ave Maria, and the Senfl Ave Maria based on Josquin's model, plus some of their instrumental music if time allows.
