Multi-instrumentalist and vocalist Shira Kammen has devoted herself to exploring the worlds of early and traditional music. A long-standing member of the early music groups Ensemble Alcatraz, Project Ars Nova, and Medieval Strings, she has also worked with Sequentia; Hesperion XX; the Boston Camerata; the Balkan group Kitka; the King's Noyse; the Newberry and Folger Consorts; and the Oregon, California, and San Francisco Shakespeare Festivals. She is the founder of Class V Music, a group that brings live music to river rafting trips. She has performed in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, Europe, Israel, Morocco, Latvia, Russia, and Japan, and on the Colorado, Rogue, Green, Grande Ronde, East Carson, and Klamath Rivers.

An avid music educator, Shira has taught at many summer music workshops and coached students of early music at Yale University, Case Western Reserve University, and the University of Oregon. She has also worked at specialized seminars at the Fondazione Cini in Venice, Italy, and the Schola Cantorum Basiliensis in Switzerland. She has played on a number of movie and television soundtracks when weird medieval instruments are needed.

For the first meeting of the New Year, we'll play numerous settings of *In Dulci Jubilo* and *Puer Natus in Bethlehem*, by Praetorius, Scheidt, and other fabulous Renaissance composers, ranging from 2 - 8 parts.

In late November, a carful of us (Julie Jeffrey, Ellen Fisher, Alexandra Saur and myself) visited our former Pacifica Chapter president Dalton Cantey and his wife Marilyn at their home in Santa Cruz. Another group (Peter Ballinger, Leslie Gold and Betsy St. Aubin) made a similar trip early in December.

As you may know, Dalton has pulmonary fibrosis and is no longer able to play the viol, or to make the monthly journey to our play days. Our current president, Cindi Olwell, has made a couple of trips in recent months to Santa Cruz to collect Dalton's viols and his vast collection of music, which he has generously donated to our chapter.

Ours was a lovely visit. Dalton and Marilyn were very gracious and hospitable. We had brought sack lunches, which we ate outside on their deck, surrounded by the beautiful woods and hills of Santa Cruz. After lunch we got out our viols and spent an hour or so playing, with Dalton as our audience. Marilyn, who hadn't played viol in many years, actually joined in the playing, and did very well on a borrowed bass. We're told that the second group that visited a few weeks later had a similar gratifying experience, with the bonus of being introduced to Marilyn's beloved horse, which is housed in a stable on the property.

While I was organizing these visits, there were some people who were interested in going, but were not available on those dates. If there are still some who would like to make the trip, I will contact Dalton and Marilyn again to see if another such visit is possible. If you are interested, please let me know.
