Gretchen Claassen, a versatile chamber musician, often performs with diverse groups around the San Francisco Bay Area and beyond. A member of American Bach Soloists, she has also recently appeared with Seattle Baroque Orchestra, Musica Angelica and Musica Pacifica. A graduate of The Juilliard School and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Gretchen is a founding member of the period ensembles MUSA and the Sylvestris Quartet, as well as the Cello Street Quartet.

Start the new year off with some soulsoothing counterpoint for 4 to 7 viols, thanks to the sublime sacred music of Franz Tunder, Buxtehude's predecessor at the Marienkirche Lübeck. We'll talk a little bit about rhetoric, how to make a musical plan, and also technical issues related to good ensemble playing.

Semper Phantasticus explores that most avantgarde mode of music-making among German composers of the 17th and early 18th centuries, with extravagant works for violin, viola da gamba, and harpsichord. All three instruments are featured individually and in combination on this program, in sonatas by Dietrich Buxtehude and Heinrich Ignaz Franz Biber, two of the best-known exponents of the "fantastical style," alongside works by August Kerzinger, Philipp Heinrich Erlebach, Johann Jakob Walther, and Johann Sebastian Bach.

Lessons and coachings with Wendy Gillespie

From Jan. 1-8 Wendy Gillespie will be available for consort coaching and individual lessons.

Wendy Gillespie taught early bowed strings, historical performance and early notation at Indiana University for more than 30 years. As a member of the viol consorts Fretwork and Phantasm, she shared three Gramophone awards. She has participated in 100 recordings for Linn, Harmonia Mundi, EMI and Virgin Classics. She received Early Music America's Thomas Binkley Award in 2011, and is past President of the Viola da Gamba Society of America.

Quartets for Carl Friedrich Abel Johann Christian Bach's Opus 8

Since 1764, J. C. Bach and his friend the great viol player Carl Friedrich Abel had been living in London, among a society of very collegial English (and German expatriate) musicians working for Queen Charlotte (Mrs. King George III), the grand patroness of the arts.

Among the music Bach published were an unusual set of quartets for violin, flute or oboe, viola, and continuo (many editions, starting in 1772). Recent research has revealed that the original (manuscript) scoring was for viola da gamba rather than viola, and that the later, published version featured a viola part only because of the scarcity of competent viol players at the time.

The viol player who played the part originally for the queen's musicians was, of course, Bach's friend Abel, who was (together with Ludwig Christian Hesse) the last of the great virtuosi of that instrument. One can safely assume the part was written for him. The manuscript viol parts are idiosyncratic and demanding (the published viola parts were "dumbed down" for publication). Our performance features David Morris playing the part of C. F. Abel, and Katherine Heater as Queen Charlotte, who often sat in as the harpsichordist of the group. The original violin, flute, and oboe players are unknown, but our present day substitutes are local stars you know and love. As far as we can find out, these quartets have never been performed before on the West Coast in this original form!

Bass Viol For Sale

Made by Wolfgang Uebel shortly before I bought it for my wife at a music store in Zurich during the early 1970s, the viol has 6 strings and, in addition to the maker's name, bears the number 2351. It has a decoratively carved scroll at the top, purfled edges, and a decorated rosette. Its length is 66 cm (26 in.), as measured from the nut to the bridge. The bow, which has a hard case, was recently rehaired. It also has a soft carrying case with a dozen or so extra strings. During the 1990s it was professionally appraised in Santa Fe at \$4,525. But in December my son found one (sans bow and case) by the same maker and period, almost identical in every respect to ours on a European web page with a value equivalent to \$5,668.83 in U.S. dollars.

My wife of 64 years passed away recently, and I am eager to find a new home for her gamba with a musician who would appreciate its outstanding workmanship, tone and condition. Please contact me with any questions.
