Pat O'Scannell is a multi-instrumentalist and singer who was employed from 1980-1990 at the award-winning Oregon Shakespeare Festival before becoming music director for the Early Music ensemble there, providing nightly historic music performances on the Green. Her ensemble The Terra Nova Consort has made 15 recordings, two of which received critical acclaim worldwide by the New York Times, Washington Post, Chicago Tribune, San Francisco Chronicle, Mittelbayerische Zeitung, El Sureta de Tabasco and the Boston Globe. Her group toured both nationally and internationally, appearing twice at the Tage Alter Musik Festival in Regensburg in 2000 and 2003, and maintained a performing collaboration with the Mexican group Los Tiempos from 2000-2007. The TNC won several awards featuring O'Scannell's arrangements, including the Millennium of Music Award and the EMA/ Dorian recording competition.

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Pat has been heard on St. Paul Sunday (MN), West Coast Live (CA), The Prairie Home Companion (OR), Harmonia (IN), In the Mode (CA) and many other NPR syndicated broadcasts worldwide. She now directs a nonprofit organization Musica Matrix which supports early music performances in Southern Oregon.

Dowland's Lachrimae has become canon in the annals of consort music! "Unfit guests in these joyful times," these seven tears of extreme beauty are cried out by five viols and lute, Dowland's instrument. This performance is significantly different from most in that the music is ornamented in a style appropriate to the period and in defiance of a certain modern Puritanism that demands total adherence to the written page. The embellishment adds expressive elegance and musical freedom that we hope enhances the audience's "joy and gladness"! Les Voix humaines, the viol duo <u>Susie Napper</u> and <u>Margaret Little</u>, has thrilled audiences worldwide with dashing performances of early and contemporary music for three decades.

Their musical complicity has been compared to the skill of two trapeze artists or the telepathic communion of a pair of jazz saxophonists!

Over the past three decades the duo has toured the world (North America, Europe, the Baltic, Far East, Australia and New Zealand), and made over forty recordings on the ATMA Classique label (Diapason d'Or, Choc du Monde de la Musique, Repertoire-Classica 10, Goldberg 5, Classics Today 10/10).

Their marathon recording of the complete <u>Concerts a deux violes ésgales</u> by Sieur de Ste Colombe is a world première.

They are joined in this concert by colleagues who share their profound joy of experimentation.

Feb. 20-24 Santa Fe Viol Workshop

For Ye Violls 2020 presents an intimate four-day weekend workshop for viol players at all levels featuring five-part consort repertoire from England, Germany and Italy. Each class will be limited to five players with at least two classes each day one-to-a-part. There will be free time each afternoon for an extra class, siesta or sightseeing, and after-dinner playing welcome to all. It's a four-day program this year: arrive Thursday afternoon and depart Monday after lunch!

The workshop's three instructors—Larry Lipnik, Sarah Mead, and Mary Springfels—are among the most outstanding coaches in the field. There will be nine formal sessions, plus a final reading in the Retreat Center's marvelous chapel. Ensembles will change from class to class as appropriate to players' levels; every player will work with every instructor.

The workshop venue is the Immaculate Heart of Mary Retreat Center on Santa Fe's scenic Museum Hill. This pastoral site features modern amenities with comfortable rooms. The double rooms are especially spacious, some with partitions. Several single rooms will be available. Each room has a private bath. The food is to die for—Seriously!

"We welcome players of all levels, including those new to the instrument; however there will only be 5 beginner slots available.

"Use this <u>self-rating guide</u> from the VdGSA to assess your level. If you fall into the B or B+ category and wish to participate we encourage you to register as early as possible due to a limited number of slots available for players at this level."
