Amy Brodo (cello and gamba) performed for many years in Italy, Israel, and England with positions including assistant principal cellist of the Orchestra del Maggio Musicale Fiorentino in Italy, and cellist with the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra. As a freelancer in Europe, she performed with several period and modern instrument groups.

Now based in California, Ms. Brodo has performed on viola da gamba and Baroque cello with groups that include Lux Musica, Sex Chordae Consort of Viols, Magnificat Baroque Orchestra, American Bach Soloists, El Mundo, Musica Angelica, Archetti and Albany Consort. She has played on over twenty commercially produced recordings.

Amy plays principal cello with the Livermore Opera Companies, judges competitions and is a founding member of the piano quartet with



voice, Persephone Chamber Ensemble; her group Harmonia Felice is now an affiliate of SFEMS. She has coached for the North South Viol Meet in Fresno, Pacifica Viols, Marin Headlands Workshop, and the SFEMS Music Discovery Workshop.

We'll look at Sinfonie à 5 consort music for viols by Leonora Duarte (1610 – 1678?), a Portuguese Jewish Marrano composer living in Antwerp, as a member of a prosperous and prominent artistic and musical family. During the Inquisition in Spain and Portugal, many Jews migrated to the rest of Europe and many converted back to Judaism or led a double life, outwardly Christian, but at home, in private, celebrating Jewish traditions. Duarte was considered extremely talented and studied many instruments as well as composition. These Sinfonie, which are the only published pieces of hers to have survived, are firmly rooted in the 17th century traditions.

This program has just about everything we want: a viol, a lute, and French music! Also two of our favorite hotshots playing the music we love; we expect you'll love it too. They will be playing music from all five of Marais' books, from Book I (1686) to Book 5 (1725), including the iconic "Labyrinthe," a musical journey through many curious keys, some hitherto unknown to viol players. As well as chamber music, Marais was famous for his operas, and it shows in his extroverted instrumental style, and in the sheer variety of the music he composed for the viol.

The viol and the theorbo are, of course, sister instruments; they share the basic (lute) tuning and fingerboard layout. Many 17th century viol players were also employed as lutenists or theorbo players. Marais wrote that he preferred his viol music to be accompanied by theorbo rather than harpsichord, so we're doing it his way this time. John Lenti has made a specialty of arranging Marais' solo viol music for the theorbo, an extra treat for this concert.
