Join us for a Zoom PlayDay with Erik Andersen and Gretchen Claassen Sat. May 9, 10-11:30 am

As we aren't able to gather together to make music in our usual PlayDay format due to COVID-19, we are planning an alternative—an online session on Zoom.

Housemates and professional viol players Erik Andersen and Gretchen Claassen will co-lead our first Pacifica Zoom meeting.' It will of course not be the same as our usual monthly gathering, but you won't have to drive anywhere, can play in the comfort of your own home, and enjoy seeing Pacifica friends as we learn some new music together.

Erik Andersen brings a deep sense of curiosity and attention to detail in his performing and teaching with an eclectic background in literature and education informing his engagement with audiences in interactive and intimate settings. You can see him regularly around the Bay Area as well as his native New York, and abroad in chamber music and early music ensembles. Erik Andersen is on faculty at the San Francisco Community Music Center, and recently served as viola da gamba faculty at Viols West Workshop (2018), and the Viola da Gamba Society of America's national conference, "Conclave" (2019).

Gretchen Claassen, a versatile chamber musician, has performed with some of the West Coast's leading baroque specialists, including American Bach Soloists, Portland Baroque Orchestra, Musica Angelica, Musica Pacifica, Agave Baroque and Ars Minerva, and is the recipient of the 2015 Jeffrey Thomas Award. She is also a founding member of MUSA and the Cello Street Quartet, which has taken her around the world participating in the American Music Abroad program through the U.S. State Department.

Our May 9 PlayDay Plan:

We'll sample some 3-part music for treble, tenor, and bass viol by Coperario, Lupo and Purcell.

Erik and Gretchen will rotate playing the 3 parts. Each person will hear just Erik & Gretchen (and themselves of course), but no one else. Sometimes you will be playing your line independently as they play the other two voices; at other times, you'll be doubling with one of them.

Bowings and Fingerings:

In an email to all member sent 4/20 by Ellen Fisher (check your inbox), we attached a pdf of all the scores with bowings and fingerings for the more difficult passages marked by Erik and Gretchen.

NOTE: These scanned scores <u>may not print</u> <u>well</u>, as they are fairly faded; they were emailed so that you can look at them on your screen, then copy the bowings and fingerings onto the scores you will have printed using the links above.

Q: Why we can't just all play together and hear the whole group?

A: There's a tiny **lag time** on Zoom between you speaking (or playing) and others hearing you. That's not a real problem for a group when talking together, but it is a nightmare trying to play music together.

How will our Zoom session work?

To sign up:

- I. Send an email to Gretchen: gmclaassen@gmail.com. (Note the double 'aa' and double 'ss')
- 2. Type "Pacifica PlayDay" in the Subject line.
- 3. Tell her what instrument(s) you will be playing, sign your name and send it off.
- 4. You will then receive a confirmation email from Gretchen with a link to the Zoom meeting, along with the meeting ID and password.

If you register but don't get a confirmation email from Gretchen, please let Ellen know at erfisher@gmail.com.

- 5. Everyone who has signed up will also get a reminder email the night before the PlayDay.
- 6. On May 9, the "meeting space" will open about 9:45 am so you can have a few minutes to greet folks. At the end, there will be some time to socialize with each other.

- Audio settings

From Crisis to Comedy:

Gamba News 2001-02

In an ongoing series of reports, your secretary is delving into the files of Gamba News from the past. All of the extant files have been scanned and uploaded on our website, under Newsletter Archive. If you have a stash of old newsletters, please cross-check the archive (see above) to see if you might have some of the missing ones. We especially need 2011-2014 issues.

The 2001-02 season began normally enough. In the <u>September</u> issue, Lyle York, Gamba News editor, reported on Viols West (66 attending!). Julie Jeffrey was president.

But in the October issue, we find a sudden shift to a now-familiar tone: "In these sad and fearful times." The crisis that began on Sept. 11, 2001—like our present pandemic—affected everyone, but Pacifica kept going. Lyle wrote urging members to renew their

memberships: "You will be supporting both the U.S. economy and the VdGS/Pacifica treasury. And you will be giving yourself a reason to keep both feet on the floor."

In <u>December</u>, we had articles about flying with viols in light of the new (pre-TSA) flight restrictions; Wendy Gillespie wrote that all the viols had to be checked and her nail-clippers were confiscated.

On a brighter note, the November Gamba News reported that viols were welcome at the new SFEMS Wednesdaynight "collegium evenings," at St. Alban's – focusing on one or two pieces with a professional coach. (Did these evenings continue? Were they the harbingers of Sal Blaker's Early Music Open Mic?)

In May, Gamba News featured Peter Ballinger's review of a recital by Paolo Pandolfo at First Church, Berkeley.

In <u>June</u>, Ellen Farwell wrote previewing the extensive viol events at the 2002 Berkeley Festival.

And in April, a journalistic coup!: the inside story about how Barbie came to play the violone (chosen for her because of course her knees don't bend) and ended up marrying harpsichord Ken. (Reminder: the date of the issue was April 1, 2002). Here's Barbie on tour with Sex Chordae (she says she wasn't holding a bow because "my nails weren't dry").
