# Come to our final PlayDay with coach Farley Pearce Sat., May 14, 9:30 - 11:30 am



We'll premiere a new composition by Michael Kimbell, written especially for us! I think you'll appreciate Michael's inspired and skillful expression of the text as well as the richly colored, full, and even brilliant sonorities. The text is "Come, sleep," by Sir Phillip Sydney(1554-1586).

We'll also play the chanson, "Amour, dy moy de grace," from "Chansons, Odes, et Sonetz de Pierre Ronsard," published in 1576 (see p. 2). Ronsard is regarded as the greatest of the French Renaissance poets; his verses were set by many composers. The four-part setting is by Jean de Castro (ca. 1540-1611), regarded in his time as the second most prominent and widely published polyphonist after di Lasso. Castro was a lutenist and prolific freelance composer with over 30 collections of chansons, madrigals and sacred works. His dedications, addressed to culturally ambitious, wealthy members of the merchant middle class, give insight into music-making in private households.

I thank Edith and Michael for providing wonderful parts with text underlay which adds so much to the playing experience.

Farley Pearce is a San Francisco freelance musician who plays cello, viols, violone, bass violin, and contrabass. He has played with the

(O gentil serviteur!) la puissante vertu
Des beaux yeux de t'amie?
Plus je repens mes traits sur hommes et sur Dieux,
Et plus en un moment fournissent les yeux
De ta belle Marie.

Love, tell me, pray, Who furnishes you with arrows, Seeing that, always armed, in a thousand places, You sink in the hearts of men and of gods Your darts feathered with sparks?


#### A recommendation from Farley:

#### **Going to Conclave!**

Pat Jennerjohn and I are very much looking forward to attending Conclave in person this summer, July 24 through 31, in Oxford, Ohio, on the campus of Miami University. Conclave has been held there before and I hear it's a favorite location. This is the first time I am flying to Conclave, which is held alternately in the Western, Central, and Eastern regions of the US in successive years, usually on the campus of a college or university. Before this, I have only been to the Conclaves held just west of Portland, Oregon, where I could drive and take as many instruments as I wanted to play. But flying, I will need to restrict myself to just my treble, which I can take as a carry-on item, so I know it will be safe.

Why are we going so far, at significant cost? There are two reasons:

I) Pat is the chairperson of the VdGSA Investment Committee, which will meet there, and I am the Chapter Representative from Pacifica Viola da Gamba Society to Viola da Gamba Society of America, so we each have meetings to attend; and 2) it's just a lot of fun to choose classes with some of my favorite teachers, hear their take on music, some of which is familiar and some not yet, and play with friendly people from all over the country (some of whom I already know and some I will get to know) with a pro to help you all improve, all day (even into the evening!), every day for 6 whole days!

and there are a lot to choose from! There are 23 faculty bios and pictures posted, some very familiar like our own Julie Jeffrey, David Morris, and Elisabeth Reed. New teachers include Josh Keller, whom I met about 5 years ago when he traveled to SF to participate in a seminar at SF Conservatory of Music and asked for local hospitality, which we provided. He gave me an afternoon of playing together in return—a wonderful gift!

If this isn't the year for you to travel to Ohio, start more locally when Conclave comes to the West. I think the next time in the West is 2024, but that needs confirmation. We do not do Viols West in a year Conclave is held in the West. After my first Conclave, I wondered why I hadn't started going sooner. It is a rich learning experience and a very fun party all at the same time, and it's never too soon to go, since there are classes for every level, even beginners!
