Multi-instrumentalist **Shira Kammen** has spent much of her life exploring the worlds of early and traditional music of all kinds. A member for many years of the early music Ensembles Alcatraz and Project Ars Nova, she has also worked with Sequentia, Hesperion XX, the Boston Camerata, storyteller/harpist Patrick Ball, singers Anne Azema, Azam Ali, and Joanna Newsom, the Balkan group Kitka, Anonymous IV, the King's Noyse, the Newberry and Folger Consorts, The Compass of the Rose, and the Oregon, California and San Francisco Shakespeare Festivals.

Shira is also the founder of Class V Music, an ensemble dedicated to providing music on river rafting trips.

She has worked with students in many different settings, among them teaching summer music workshops in the woods, coaching students of early music in such



schools as Yale University, Case Western Reserve University, the University of Oregon at Eugene, and working at specialized seminars at the Fondazione Cini in Venice, Italy and the Scuola Cantorum Basiliensis in Switzerland. She has also played on a number of movie and television soundtracks, when weird medieval instruments are needed.

John Jenkins worked for the court of Charles I (until that employer was executed). Jenkins survived the Commonwealth as a resident musician in the house of a wealthy Catholic and was then employed by the court again after the Restoration. However, since the new monarch, Charles II, had no taste for counterpoint (he liked a good tune, but had difficulty with the complications of more complex music), most of Jenkins' later music was composed for private employers. His music is fabulously skillfully composed, intricate and subtle, with constantly evolving ideas.



This concert is the sixth of what has become an annual series of one-composer viol consort concerts. We recommend reserving seats as this concert has been extremely popular in the past.

Pacifica's PlayDay COVID policy —effective 12/22

Masks are optional – however, do wear a mask if that makes sense for you!

- We ask that you test negative within 24 hours of a PlayDay if you are "at risk," i.e.,
 - I. You have <u>not been fully vaccinated</u> (we interpret that as the initial double vaccination and at least one booster)
 - 2. OR you have travelled recently
 - 3. OR you have been exposed to someone who is sick or has tested positive

<u>Please stay home if you have any symptoms or any doubt.</u>

If you forget to test, we will have tests available on site for you.

This new policy replaces the waiver that we had participants sign in the past.



Announcing: The VdGSA's 61st Annual Conclave

July 23–30, 2023 University of Rhode Island, Kingston, RI

This summer's Conclave will be held at the University of Rhode Island, in the little town of Kingston, thirty miles south of Providence. The lovely beach resort of Narragansett is close by, as well as Newport with its historic mansions, many restaurants, and other sights.

Kingston is on the Amtrak train line running between New York City and Boston.

This will be our first Conclave on the East Coast since 2018 in Cullowhee, NC and the first time we've been in New England since we were in Rindge, NH in 2008.



Registration for Conclave 2023 will open on VdGSA's website in the spring.

VdGSA's Private Lesson Subsidy Program

Hi everyone! I'm the administrator for this program, which was started as a pilot program and which the board adopted as a permanent program at its board meeting at Conclave this year. Teachers who have students using the program have reported that it is a lifeline, that the students are delighted, and that they made good use of it.

Under the program, students in self-defined financial need may apply for monetary assistance to take private lessons. This is a rolling application process; if accepted, a student will be reimbursed for \$40/lesson for up to six private lessons within a year of the acceptance of the application. Students are

responsible for paying the balance of the cost of the lesson. They may choose any teacher who is listed as a teaching member in the VdGSA Directory who is a current member, and the lessons may be in-person or online.
