### February Meeting

Our next meeting will be our annual coached session with John Dornenburg. This will begin at 9:30 AM on February 8, at Braun Rehearsal Hall, Stanford University. Fee for this workshop: \$15 for playing members, \$20 for Newsletter members and others. Groups will be formed as usual, based on the information you give in the return card, so please send these in as soon as possible. After lunch, available at one of the adjacent cafeterias, John will talk about 'The Great Dooble Bass'. Following his talk, there will be an opportunity for preformed viol consorts to perform with John coaching.

In the evening, be sure to set a course for Berkeley to hear the SFEMS Concert, including Mary Springfels (see below for information).

Getting to Stanford: from Hwy 101 N, take Embarcadero Rd; (from Hwy 101 S take University Av) west to Campus Drive. Turn left and continue on Campus Drive until it becomes Campus Drive East. Turn right on Mayfield Av and park in the large lot opposite Braun Music Center.

From Hwy 280 N take Alpine Rd easterly, turning right at Junipero Serra Rd; (from 280 S take Sand Hill Rd easterly, turning right at Santa Cruz Av, then left on Junipero Serra at Alpine): continue on Junipero Serra, taking the left fork onto Campus Drive West, and turn left on Mayfield Av to the parking lot.
