A number of us were fortunate to work with her during summer workshops given by VdGS/West in Southern California, and we remember her vibrant personality and good humor. She has asked that small groups - dues, tries, quartets - perform for her. We shall be mailing a registration form later this month for the afternoon session, and we shall make it a full day of celebration starting with a regular chapter play/meeting in the Schedule: 10:00 - 12:00 (playing)/lunch/1:30 - 5:30 (workshop). The fee for all of this is minimal - \$10 for both players and auditors - so plan to join us! Out-of-towners are offered overnight accomodations with chapter members.


