

# In Memoriam

Ellen Alexander

Ellen Alexander was one of the founding members of East Bay Recorder Society and a member of the Viola da Gamba Society. She died in late October at the age of 84. A woman of competence and grace, a caring friend and relative, a creative weaver and jewelry maker by profession, and a musician who loved early music, Ellen will be missed by all who knew her.

Professionally, Ellen was a weaver, jewelry and clothing designer in the San Francisco Bay Area since the

end of World War II. On the music side, she was a member of AMICI MUSICAE, an early music group centered in the San Francisco Bay Area which maintained an impressive touring schedule for many years. She acted as president of the local American Recorder Society, and was a member of the Viola da Gamba Society — Pacifica Chapter. She played treble at Play Days for many years.

Ellen died in Sonoma on October 21, 2007.
