MusicSources was host to this very successful meeting, at which five groups performed for our distinguished panel the Sett of Vyalls consort. Each group was allotted a scrupulously timed half-hour for playing and advice. With four lively panelists (Wendy Gillespie, Carol Herman, Mary Springfels and Margriet Tindemans) there was no lack of constructive criticism. Many thanks to all of the participants. In the morning, four rooms were used for group playing, not without some last-minute reorganizing caused by a tenor with a collapsed sound post! After the workshop, Peter Ballinger led a group of about twelve players in pieces by A. Gabrieli and Guami, for ten and eight voices respectively. The composer Léonie Jenkins came to hear the five groups, a

sign that a new piece for viols may be germinating!

Tuning Frets

I am somewhat diffident in bringing up this topic: I expect to hear more from experts among our readers — but, having enjoyed

the warm intonation of the Sett of Vyalls consort when they performed at First Congregational Church in Berkeley, on the eve of our January workshop, I would like to pass on the information that the frets of all of their viols were carefully tuned to the Vallotti and Young tempered scale on the afternoon of the concert. following table gives the pitch adjustment that should be made to each note of a suitable tuning device in order to give the Vallotti & Young tunings. The numbers are cents (hundredths of an equally tempered semitone). Thus to tune the first fret, after adjusting the open A string to 415 (or whatever A is desired), the fret should be moved until the stopped string is in tune with an A# that is 6 cents sharp. The second fret should give a stopped string that sounds 6 cents flat, and so on. The other pitches (F to G#) can be used to make sure that the frets have been moved the same distance under the other strings. The strings must be true (i.e. of constant diameter, density etc. along their length) for these adjustments to be meaningful. The Werckmeister III tunings are given for comparison, and both tunings might be useful if the gamba were played with a similarly tuned harpsichord.
