February Meeting

As announced in last month's Newsletter, the February meeting will be held jointly with the Mid-Peninsula Recorder Orchestra (MPRO). This will be our first joint venture with one of the oldest established early music groups in the Bay Area. Fred Palmer informs me that of the 16 MPRO members who intend to come, the astonishing total of eleven have volunteered to try out on viols! To meet this challenge, our members should plan to bring more than one viol each. The meeting will start with tuning and socializing at 9:30 AM, February 9 at Duveneck School multipurpose room, Alester Avenue at Channing, Palo Alto (tiny map, p.2). The morning will be spent in group playing for recorders only; viols only; and viol initiation for recorder players. Bring your lunch. In the afternoon, more ensemble playing, including as much broken consort as possible (A-440 alert!), concluding with massed group playing. Seven rooms will be available, so there should be plenty of variety. So bring suitable music (most recorder ensemble music is playable at sight by viols), extra viols, and lunch!

The rental fee for the school facilities is being shared by/Pacifica and MPRO. However, the fee would be voided if some of our members would play for the school assembly for half an hour on a day (TBA) in April. IMPORTANT: send in your reply card as soon as possible, to Julie Jeffrey: avoid the postal rate hike (to 19¢ on Feb 3), and make her job of organising groups easier. This will be an especially time-consuming task because of the mixed ensembles. Let us know what instruments you will bring, and if you could play for the school assembly.

She then entertained and challenged us by leading us in group improvisations on short, Ortiz-like themes, with no music in front of us. We were so stimulated by this exercise that the concluding large group playing (Gabrieli a7, 8 and 10) went on until 4:45, with general reluctance to stop. This workshop was held at First Presbyterian Church of Hayward: our thanks to the church and to John Mark, who made the arrangements.


