January Meeting

First of all, Happy New Year! We start the year with a Workshop with John Dornenburg, to be given at Braun Music Center, January 9 at 9:45 AM. John's topic will be "A Survey of Bowing Techniques: Historical and Modern." The remainder of the day will consist of ensembles to be coached in rotation by John. Fee for the Workshop will be the usual \$20 (\$15 for Playing members). Please send in your reply card promptly, as the holiday has caused delays in getting this information to you. If you can come for only part of the day, please state which part on the card, so we can schedule John's talk at the optimum time for the majority of attendees.

Getting there: from highway 101 N, take Embarcadero Rd (from 101 S take University Av) west to Campus Drive. Turn left and pursue Campus Drive until it becomes Campus Drive East. Turn right on Mayfield Av and park in the large lot opposite Braun Music Center.

From Highway 280 N take Alpine Road easterly (from 280 S take Sand Hill Rd easterly), turn right at Junipero Serra Road or Santa Cruz Av respectively (Santa Cruz meets Junipero Serra at Alpine, so be ready for the *left* turn there). Continue on Junipero Serra, taking the left fork onto Campus Drive East (i.e., skip Campus Drive West!) and turn *left* on Mayfield Av to the parking lot.


Viols by the Sea
