From Mary Prout: I first saw Ellen at a recorder society meeting in Riverside, California in the early 1970s, when I was still in high school and had begun playing the recorder. She was carrying a large string

instrument, and I asked someone what that thing was; she said "It's a gamba!" Ellen was the first person I ever saw play the instrument.

I later got to know her well when I joined the UC Riverside Collegium Musicum a year or two later. She was among the revered members of the previous year's crop of students. It was a tight knit group, and we were in awe of them. Ellen continued to work on her master's degree, and to play in the collegium as the older group moved on, and we moved in. Ellen Farwell was a mentor to all of us beginners on the VIOL. When playing in consort groups she encouraged us with her calm, kind words. She also loved to sing and play at the same time! That really impressed me!

She still had that life force and courage to face adversity and a positive outlook on life. What was so important to her in the end was family. She was so happy to have many photos of her family in her room.

She left me with the thought: What is important in life? Something for all of us to think about...
