Julie Jeffrey has been playing the viol since 1976. She has performed throughout the U.S., in Canada, Mexico, Europe and Australia, and teaches privately and at workshops in the U.S. and abroad.

Ms. Jeffrey is a founding member of Sex Chordae Consort of Viols, Wildcat Viols, Antic Faces, and The Barefoot All-Stars, and she embodies half of the viol duo Hallifax & Jeffrey.

Ms. Jeffrey is co-founder and co-director of Barefoot Chamber Concerts, and has served on the board of directors of The Viola da Gamba Society of America, The Pacifica Viola da Gamba Society, and The San Francisco Early Music Society.



PURCELL! Our morning session will feature a first-ever reading of two pieces I have recently added to my growing collection of Purcell transcriptions and arrangements. Both pieces are taken from Henry Purcell's incidental music for the London Theatre.

The first piece, "Ah, how sweet it is to love," exists in two settings: a solo song with continuo, from *Tyrannic Love*; and an orchestral arrangement, from *The Virtuous Wife*. We will first look at the song (everyone will get to play the melody), and appreciate Purcell's melodic and text-setting genius.

Then we will break out into the four-part orchestral setting and discover how Purcell's exquisite harmonic language enhances a great tune.

We will end our session with a reading of the second piece, an orchestral march from the incidental music from *The Married Beau*.



Our 2024 Financial Report

- Nick Jones, Pacifica treasurer

I have finished the financials and reporting for the society. The 990EZ form has been filed with the IRS, as well the CA Attorney General, Secretary of State, and Franchise Tax Board. The 990EZ form is available on our website (under "ABOUT").

Some highlights:

- Donations are almost doubled from 2023.
- We gave out almost \$2000 in tuition and travel to 2024 Conclave for 4 players.
- Rental income is down 16% from 2023.
- Membership dues are about equal to last year (currently 66 members).
- Five time slots available (max 15 minutes).
- 4 music stands are available; BYO stand light.
- Donations by performers and audience members are appreciated to help cover the cost of the venue.
- Next date: May 28

We'll take a break in June and July, and return in August.
