# Join us at our PlayDay with coach Julie Jeffrey

Julie Jeffrey has been playing the viol since 1976. She has performed throughout the U.S., in Canada, Mexico, Europe and Australia, and teaches privately and at workshops in the U.S. and abroad. Ms. Jeffrey is a founding member of Sex Chordae Consort of Viols, Wildcat Viols, Antic Faces, and The Barefoot All-Stars, and she embodies half of the viol duo Hallifax & Jeffrey. Ms. Jeffrey is co-founder and co-director of Barefoot Chamber Concerts, and has served on the board of directors of the Viola da Gamba Society of America, Pacifica Viola da Gamba Society, and San Francisco Early Music Society.

#### Calling all low basses!

As we continue to observe the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Orlando Gibbons' passing, let's find out just how low he can go!



# The centerpiece of our morning session will be his Fantasia no. I a4, featuring the "Great Dooble Base."

The instrument Gibbons had in mind for this delightful piece was almost certainly a six-string bass tuned in A, but the part can be played on any viol that is able to go down to that really low A below the bass clef; so, A-basses, G-violones, 7-string basses, and even lower things will all be welcomed with open arms to this session.

To begin exploring the basement, we will warm up with a six-part Pavan and Galliard, both of which call for a low C in the bass part. After feasting on the "Great Dooble Base" Fantasia, there might be a little dessert: a new low-C-friendly arrangement of Gibbons' Lord Salisbury's Pavan is currently in the works. If it is ready by the time we meet, I'll bring it along for us to try out.



I am the administrator of the VdGSA Private Lesson Subsidy program.

VdGSA members in self-defined financial need may apply for a subsidy to take private lessons. They are eligible for reimbursement of up to \$40 per lesson, and up to nine lessons per year. The students, who must be members, apply on the Members' area of our website.

Applications are taken on a rolling basis throughout the year.

After being accepted, the students arrange for and pay their teachers the going rate, and then submit a receipt for reimbursement via the website. They may choose anyone listed as a teaching member in the directory and the lessons may be in-person or online.
